1. What Is the 3-1-1 Rule?

- **3.4 ounces (100 milliliters) per container:** Each liquid, gel, or aerosol item must be in a container no larger than 3.4 ounces (100 ml).
- **1 quart-sized clear bag:** All containers must fit comfortably in a single, transparent, resealable quart-sized bag.
- **1 bag per passenger:** Each traveler is allowed only one quart-sized bag of liquids in their carry-on.

This ensures that items like shampoo, lotion, perfume, and beverages meet airport security standards without causing delays.
